This is her second pregnancy; her previous pregnancy ended in a spontaneous miscarriage at 8 weeks and was not examined. This pregnancy is desired. Indicate the treatment plan:

2. Legend for the patient

You are a 24-year-old woman, 9-10 weeks into your second pregnancy. You complain of lower abdominal pain and spotting from the genital tract. Medical history: your previous pregnancy ended in a spontaneous miscarriage at 8 weeks; you were not examined. This pregnancy is desired.

You are registered with a gynecologist. General condition is satisfactory. Consciousness is clear. Blood pressure, pulse, and body temperature are normal. Skin is clean and pink in color. There is spotting on the pad.

3. Educational questions about a clinical case

A 24-year-old woman visited her family doctor. She is in her second pregnancy, 9-10 weeks along. She complains of lower abdominal pain and spotting from the genital tract. Medical history: her previous pregnancy ended in a spontaneous miscarriage at 8 weeks; she was not examined. This pregnancy is desired. She is registered with a gynecologist. There is spotting on her sanitary pad.

Objectively: General condition is satisfactory. Consciousness is clear. Vesicular breathing in the lungs, no wheezing. RR - 20 per minute. Heart sounds are muffled, rhythmic. Pulse 92 per minute (rapid). BP - 90/60 mm Hg. Skin is clean, pink in color. Temperature 36.6°C.

Probable diagnosis: spontaneous miscarriage. Pregnancy 9-10 weeks.

Emergency hospitalization in the gynecology department of the maternity hospital is necessary, accompanied by an ambulance with a referral!
